The venue is the historic Brooklands Museum which will be open to the Public as usual. The original 2.7mile banked circuit was built by Hugh Fortescue Locke-King in 1906, on part of his estate, as the Worlds first purpose-built motor racing circuit, and operated from 1907 to 1939. Parts of the original circuit still exist including the iconic Members Banking at almost 30ft high.

Maidstone and Mid Kent Motor Club Ltd are delighted to be running their second round of the BTRDA® Autotest Championship 2025, with a new event The Brooklands National Autotest which will also be a round of the 2025 Motorsport UK Autotest Championship, and the 2025 Southern Autotest Championship.

THE BROOKLANDS NATIONAL AUTOTEST

- 1. The **Maidstone and Mid Kent Motor Club Limited** will promote a **Clubmans** permit Autotest on **Sunday 3rd August 2025** at **Brooklands Museum**, Weybridge, Surrey
- 2. The meeting will be held under the **National Competition Rules** of the **Motorsport UK** (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organising Club may issue for the Event.
- 3. The Event will be run under **Clubmans Permit No: 203999** issued by **Motorsport UK**, which will be on display on the day.
- 4. The Event is open to entries from :
 - a) All fully elected members of the Maidstone & Mid Kent Motor Club Ltd;
 - b) Fully elected members of the **BTRDA**®;
 - c) Registered entrants in the 2025 demon tweeks / BestFed BTRDA® Autotest Championship;
 - d) Registered entrants in the 2025 Motorsport UK Autotest Championship;
 - e) Registered entrants in the BTRDA® Allrounders Championship 2025;
 - f) Registered entrants in the 2025 Southern Autotest Championship.
- 5. The **Autotest** Event is a round of:
 - a) The demon tweeks / BestFed BTRDA® Autotest Championship 2025;
 - b) The 2025 Motorsport UK Autotest Championship (Permit No: Ch2025/A001):
 - c) The BTRDA® Allrounders Championship 2025 (Permit No: CH2025/RALLY023 (D));
 - d) The 2025 Southern Autotest Championship. (Permit No: CH2025/A011).
- 6. All competitors must produce for inspection at signing-on a valid **Motorsport UK Competition Licence**, **(minimum requirement RS Clubman)** Championship Registration Card and Club Membership Card.

(Note – anyone who is disqualified from holding a RTA Driving Licence cannot hold a Motorsport UK Competition Licence).

- 7. The programme of the meeting will be:
 - Scrutineering starts at **08.30** am
 - Any Competitors not signed on by 10.30 am may be disqualified.
 - First car starts at 10.30 am.
- 8. The **Autotest** will consist of 5 classes as follows:
 - **A.** Touring Cars under 11' overall length (including Minis with non-original front mounted engine and transmission layout driving the front wheels)
 - **B.** All other Touring Cars
 - C. Sports Cars and Sports Kit Cars
 - **D.** Specials
 - **E.** Roadgoing Series Production Cars and Road Going Kit Cars

Note:

All vehicles must comply with the Motorsport UK Technical Regulations.

All vehicles in Class E must comply with Motorsport UK Technical Regulations and be taxed for the public road. A current MOT certificate must be produced at scrutineering; proof of registration date will be required for any vehicle exempt from MOT test.

Cabriolets must run in the appropriate touring car class with roof/hood up, or class C or E with roof/hood down, as appropriate.

All lengths refer to the overall length, which will be determined by the Parkers Car Price Guide (January 2025 edition) for the car concerned or, if not quoted, by the manufacturer's specification.

Vehicle eligibility for all classes will be in accordance with the 2025 BTRDA[®] Autotest Championship Regulations.

9. Awards will be presented as follows:

FTD The Harold Sharp Trophy* & an Award

Best BTRDA® competitor BTRDA® crested spoon

Best Performance by a full member An Award

of Maidstone & Mid-Kent MC

First in Class An Award

Second in Class An Award (subject to 5 or more starters)
Third in Class An Award (subject to 10 or more starters)

Best Novice An Award

(* These awards are to be held for 11 months only)

No competitor may win more than one award, other than the award for the Best Performance by a full member of Maidstone & Mid-Kent MC.

10. The entry list opens on publication of these Supplementary Regulations and closes finally on **Monday 28th July 2025 at 10.00pm.** The entry fee for the event is £48.50. All entries must be made on the official entry form and must be accompanied by the appropriate fee.

Note:

Entries will be accepted from Drivers without a current full RTA licence provided they comply with the requirements of (NCR 19.4.2.1)

11. Entries will only be accepted online via the Club Website at www.mmkmc.co.uk

12. Entry fees will only be refunded if notice of withdrawal is given in writing. Where notice of withdrawal is received before <u>28th July 2025</u> entry fees will be refunded in full, after that date refunds, up to a maximum of £38, will be made at the discretion of the organisers. (NCR 6.1.11.1)

LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED

- 13. The Entries Secretary is Andy Jenner (tel: 07584 060447) who will deal with all enquiries regarding entries.
- 14. The maximum entry for the meeting is **40**. The minimum is **20**. The maximum for each class is unlimited. The minimum for each class is 1. Should any of the above minimum figures not be reached, the organisers have the right to cancel the meeting or amalgamate classes as necessary. Entries will be selected as received.

- Provisional results will be published, and awards presented, as soon as possible following the end of the event.
- 17. Any protest must be lodged in accordance with the Motorsport UK Protests, (NCR 2.9.1).
- 18. Details of tests will be included with Final Instructions.

Each driver will have one run at each test

Timing will be via **Timing App Live** and mobile phones operated by the start marshals The starting signal will be oral.

Order of attempting the tests will be strictly as directed at the drivers briefing.

- 19. All marshals will be appointed as judges to adjudicate on penalties (NCR 19.1.4.1).
- 20. Practising will **NOT** be allowed **(NCR 19.1.2.4)**, any competitor, in the opinion of the organisers, speeding, or performing handbrake turns or the like, in the paddock or surrounding area may be **disqualified**.
- 21. Competitors will be identified by numbers; which will be issued at signing on.
- 22. Marking and penalties will be as printed in **Penalty Table (NCR 19.9)**:
 - (a) "Not performing a test correctly, etc" +20 seconds
 - (b) "Striking any marker, etc per mistake" + 5 seconds
 - (c) "Failing to cross or stop at any line, etc" + 5 seconds

A Wrong Test will be as defined in (NCR 19.1.3.1).

- 23. A Novice will be defined as a driver who has not previously won a class of more than 3 competitors or an overall award in an Autotest or similar competition of **Clubman**, equivalent or higher status.
- 24. Pylons may be less than 1 metre in height (NCR 19.1.2.7).
- 25. As the whole event takes place on private property vehicles need not be registered or taxed (NCR 19.3.1.2), except Class E.
- 26. A vehicle may be entered twice, to be driven by different drivers, but no driver may drive more than one vehicle (NCR 19.1.1.4k).
- 27. All other National Competition Rules of the Motorsport UK apply as written.
- 28. Please make sure your Vehicle is in good mechanical condition. In particular, please make sure that your vehicle complies with **Motorsport UK** Vehicle Regulations specific for Autotests (**NCR 19.3.1.8**). Also please ensure your engine is **properly silenced** and complies with the noise requirements of (**NCR 7.8.2**). and note tyre regulations (**NCR 7.2.13**)

29. In accordance with latest General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) the information you give us will be used only for the purpose of running MMKMC events and its activities. You will only receive communications from us that are relevant to the events you enter. Photographs may be taken at this event (and others in the programme) and shared, including on social media. Please advise the organiser if you do not wish to have your photograph taken.
